

U18 e-Safety

SOCIAL NETWORKING

We want you to be safe and happy whilst here in Cambridge, so we recommend the following when using social networks:

- Be careful what you share online.
- Please do not 'follow' any students or anyone else online.
- Always tell your parents/guardians, host family or a trusted adult if someone or something online makes you feel uncomfortable or scared.
- Do not add, follow, or give you social media details to any adults in the school, including classmates and teachers.
- Talk to your teacher, the accommodation team, or the academic management team if someone insists on adding or following you on social media.
- Check your privacy settings to ensure you do not reveal personal information to people you do not know. Use a strong password.

MEETING PEOPLE

If you are under 18 years of age then you must NOT arrange to meet with anyone you meet online. Please tell a member of staff or your host family if someone you've met online asks to meet with you

INAPPROPRIATE AND ILLEGAL CONTENT

There are some websites that are inappropriate or illegal. This includes, but not is not limited to, spam, pornography, substance abuse, violence, cyber-bullying, extremism and hate sites, and lifestyle sites that promote eating disorders, self-harm or suicide, as well as websites that promote activities that are illegal for U18s by UK law, such as alcohol and gambling.

If someone tries to share any content of this nature with you, you should tell your teacher immediately.

PHOTOS AND VIDEOS

No-one in the school is allowed to take photos or videos of U18 students unless they have written permission from your caregiver. If someone records an image of you using a camera, please ask them to delete it. **If you feel uncomfortable about someone taking a photo or video of you, please tell your teacher.**

SHARING CONTACT INFORMATION

You should not share your personal contact information with any adults in the school, including your teacher and classmates. Your teacher should only contact you through the e-School, so make sure you check it regularly. If anyone contacts you through your personal phone number or email about anything that is not related to school, please tell a member of the academic management or accommodation team.
